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





Since 2000, median rent in L.A. County is up 32% while median renter income is down 3%.






People experiencing homelessness at point-in-time count

# We housed more people than ever, yet our housing affordability crisis drove a net rise in homelessness




# Family members experiencing homelessness

# Even if you:

- > Don't have a permanent address
- > Live in a shelter, hotel, motel, car, campground, or on the street
- > Are double up with family or friends because you cannot afford your own place
- > Don't have your school or immunization records

# You have the right to:

- > Enroll in a school close to you
- > Continue at the school where you were previously enrolled
- > Receive transportation to school
- Receive free lunch at school



# SAUSD SUPPORT SERVICES AND PROGRAMS



Attention to attendance for those who have chronic absenteeism (10 or more) - home visits, parent conferences, SART Meetings, SARB meetings to find a coordinated solution to why they are having difficulty with attendance;



- Free breakfast and lunch without needing to fill out any paperwork;
- Connection to community agencies that provide medical, dental, vision, clothing and groceries as well as assistance with housing and emergency shelters; and

- Laundry program for elementary schools
- Transportation to School of Origin/Pathway of Matriculation, if they qualify.



# SUPPORT SERVICES AND PROGRAMS



❖ FAFSA letter for 12<sup>th</sup> grade unaccompanied youth (not in the physical custody of their parent or legal guardian) who are homeless and for those 12<sup>th</sup> grade unaccompanied youth who are on the verge of homelessness;

Backpacks, School Supplies, hygiene kits are provided



Review of 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students for possible inclusion in AB 1806 – State Credits only for graduation, if they qualify;











# LAUSD Homeless Education Office Data for July 2018 to June 2019


Total Students Experiencing Homelessness: 19,532
