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

A4LE BC Chapter LEE Grant (Learning Environment Enhancement)

A4LE BC Chapter is proud to be in our 5th year of offering a grant opportunity open to all K-12 schools in the province. The Learning Environment Enhancement (LEE) Grant supports schools to realize a unique vision to enhance their learning environments. Over the years, we've had the privilege of reviewing over 80 applications representing schools from numerous districts within the province and have awarded over \$35,000 in prize funds.

Each year, we are inspired by the creativity and ingenuity displayed by the applicants. Some examples of past submissions include outdoor classroom designs, sensory and resource room upgrades, makerspace tools and equipment and garden projects.

Our top prize in 2022 went to New Hazelton Elementary (Coast Mountain SC #82). The applicants used the \$5000 in grant money to build moveable workstations for their STEM lab and have since won the <u>Premier's</u> Award for Excellence in Education for Outstanding Team Collaboration.

This year, we are excited to announce a total prize pool of \$12,000 available to any school organization affiliated with students enrolled in a public or private BC K-12 school. **Look out for an email with entry details.** Submissions should be sent via email to <u>sharmayme@gmail.com</u> before the submission deadline of May 31.

He is the world's first self-certified educational furniture whisperer – capable of coaxing the greatest potential out of the unruliest school furnishings. His global practice (6 continents, 35 countries, 42 US states) includes co-facilitating Harvard's annual Learning Environments For Tomorrow Institute. In addition to working with more than 200 schools on more than 40 educational visioning and master planning efforts, Nick is a co-founder (with Dr. Fran Locker & Gabriel Diago) of the Revolution in Education Congress in Bogota and Cartagena, Colombia where he leads hands-on project-based learning experiences built upon personal, local, cultural, or global passions. Nick is the four-time host of the online webinar 24Hours of PBL+, an international celebration of Project Based Learning that includes learners and educators from 75 schools and organizations in 40 countries on 6 continents. He is the co-author (with Erin O'Reilly & Mar Cano) of TeamED: Building more effective teams for projects, education and community. He is coauthoring Web Builders Nigeria with Paul Iwok & Derek Peterson. Nick is the author of Almost, tales of failure, recovery & persistence and near brushes with discomfort. Nick has also written a children's book entitled Pelchers: childhood memories of the village store. A second children's book Fireflies will be published in 2024.
