
BASSETTI GRANT PROCESS


THE PLACE INITIATIVE




Quick Royals, run to safety!

WENATCHEE

- Channeled Scablands (considered one of the 7 wonders of Washington)
- Traditional lands of the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation, $\text{np}^{\text{ə}}\text{řq}^{\text{w}}\text{áw}^{\text{s}}\text{əx}^{\text{w}}$ (Wenatchi) and the Yakama Nation
- Wenatchee has been inhabited for more than 11,000 years according to carbon dating on Clovis stone and bone tools.
- Wenatchee is known as the “Apple Capital of the World”
