STAR

(Students Transitioning to Adult Responsibilities)

The STAR program serves posthigh school students 18 to 22 years old with mild to moderate learning disabilities. The program provides individualized education and training, with focus on daily living skills and employability.

MAPS

(Making Advancements toward Personal Success)

The MAPS program serves ninth grade to 22-year-old students who are severely medically fragile and/ or severely cognitively challenged. The program focuses on individual progress toward personal success and quality of life.

STEPS

(Students Transitioning for Educational & Personal Success)

The STEPS program serves ninth grade through 22-year-old students who have moderate to severe intellectual, cognitive and or physical disabilities. It focuses on transitioning from high school to adult life and

> independence through improving daily living skills and employability.


PROGRAMS

The Vista Education Center houses the four Davis School District programs that have been carefully developed to meet the specific educational, physical, behavioral and emotional needs of high school aged students with special needs.

STRIDE

(Students Transitioning Reaching for Independent Direction)

The STRIDE program serves ninth grade to 22-year-old students who display moderate to severe cognitive and behavioral disabilities. It is individualized for specific student needs, with a focus on learning the skills needed to become independent.


