- SaaS Contract in Negotiation
- K-12 Facility Data Resource
- Sorting / Filtering / Reporting
- Cooperative Purchasing
- Local Bond Reporting
- RFQ / RFP / Bid Results
- Construction Cost Reporting
- Statute Requires County and District Participation



Lottery Capital Funds

- Public School Building Capital Fund (1987)
 - Original Funding Corporate Tax Revenue
 - \$100 Million / Year
 - ADM-Based Allotment
- Needs-Based Public School Capital Fund (2017)
 - Joint Application Process
 - Critical Facility Needs
 - Local Matching Funds
- Public School Repair & Renovation Fund (2021)
 - \$50 Million / Year
 - Equal Allocation to 100 Counties
 - Repair, Renovation, Expansion of Classroom Facilities



- Eligibility Criteria
 - Adjusted Market Value of Taxable Real Property
 - NC Department of Revenue (data source)
- Maximum Grants
 - \$30 million Elementary Schools
 - \$40 million Middle Schools
 - \$50 million High Schools
- Eligible Uses
 - New Buildings, Additions, Repairs, and Renovations
- Local Matching Requirement
 - Ranges from 0% to 35%


- Application Evaluation Criteria
 - Prior recipients applying for an increase.
 - Counties designated as Tier 1 areas.
 - Counties with greater need and less ability to generate tax revenue.
 - Counties with a high debt-to-tax revenue ratio.
 - Projects that address critical deficiencies.
 - Projects with new construction or complete renovation.
 - Projects that consolidate two or more schools.
 - Counties that have not received a grant in three years.
 - Percentage of District Students Served
 - Start Date of Construction



- Funding History
 - \$ 30,000,000 FY17-18
 - \$ 140,684,581 FY18-19
 - \$ 58,200,000 FY19-20
 - \$ 115,311,011 FY20-21
 - \$ 395,785,890 FY21-22
 - <u>\$ 437,068,261</u> FY22-23
 - \$1,177,049,743 Total
 - 57 Grants
 - 49 Counties









NBPSCF (<u>H259</u> House Budget)

- Increases Maximum Grants (proposed)
 - \$40 million Elementary Schools
 - \$50 million Middle Schools
 - \$60 million High Schools
- Establishes Deadline (proposed)
 - Begin Construction Within 18 Months of Award
- Establishes Forfeiture Provisions (proposed)
 - Failure to Initiate Construction on Schedule
 - Significant Change to Project Scope
 - False Statement or Information in Application
 - Local Funding is Reduced after Award



- Anticipated Funding FY2023-24 Grant Cycle
 - \$ 208,252,612 (pending State Budget approval)
 - <u>\$</u> (excess net lottery rev. per GS 18C-164)
 - \$ 208,252,612+ Total (*excess lottery revenue TBD)
- FY2023-24 Submittal and Award Schedule
 - Jul. '23 Application & Guidance (anticipated)
 - Aug. '23 Application Deadline (anticipated)
 - Sept. '23 Grant Award Announcements (anticipated)



PSBRRF

- Public School Repair & Renovation Fund
 - \$50 Million / Year
 - Equal Allotment to 100 Counties
 - Procedures Similar to Annual Lottery (PSBCF)
- Eligible Expenditures
 - Repair, Renovation, Expansion of <u>Classroom</u> Facilities
 - Planning / Design / Construction
- Not Eligible
 - Debt Service Payments
 - Central Administration, Transportation Facilities



K-12 Athletic Facility Grants

- Established in SL 2021-180 (State Budget)
 - State Capital Infrastructure Fund (SCIF)
 - \$44 million for K-12 Athletic Facility Grants
- OSBM Administered Grants
 - \$31.376 million
 - Grants to 16 LEAs
 - Specific Amounts for Specific Named Projects
- DPI Administered Grants
 - \$12.624 million
 - Grants to 99 LEAs
 - Repairs & Renovations to Existing Athletic Facilities

 - Project Scope & Budget Statement
 - Quarterly, Annual, and Final Reporting
- SCIF Grant Governance
 - SL 2021-180

 - SBE Policy



ESSER Funding (Federal)

- State Law <u>AND</u> Federal Law Compliance
 - Scope of Work Identified in CCIP Application (NCDPI)
 - Federal Impact Aid Program (EDGAR)
 - Federal Procurement Rules 2 CFR 200.318 to 200.326
 - NC General Statutes Design, Construction, Schools
- Funding Expiration
 - ESSER I 9/30/2022
 - ESSER II 9/30/2023
 - ESSER III 9/30/2024

New / Pending Legislation

- Lead and Asbestos Testing in Schools (SL2021-180)
 - DHHS in cooperation with DPI
 - DHHS Contract w/RTI (<u>Clean Classrooms</u>)
 - Lead in Water Testing
 - Lead Paint and Asbestos-Containing Materials Testing
 - \$150 million for Testing and Mitigation
- <u>HB 11</u> Schools for the Deaf and Blind (SL2023-10)
 - Creates Governing Boards for Residential Schools



New / Pending Legislation

- <u>HB 488</u> Building Code Omnibus
 - Reorganizes the Building Code Council
 - Creates a Separate Residential Code Council
 - Eliminates any Requirement for Sheathing Inspections
 - Eliminates Appendix B Code Summary
 - Suspends Adoption of the Energy Code
 - Redefines Single-Family (1-2 Units) to include 3-4 Units
- <u>SB 384</u> Carbon Monoxide Detectors/Schools
 - SBE to Study Existing Schools / CO Detectors and Alarms
 - SBE to Study Existing Schools to Determine Need and Implementation of Radon Gas Testing
 - SBE Report Findings to JLEOC by Dec. 2023
