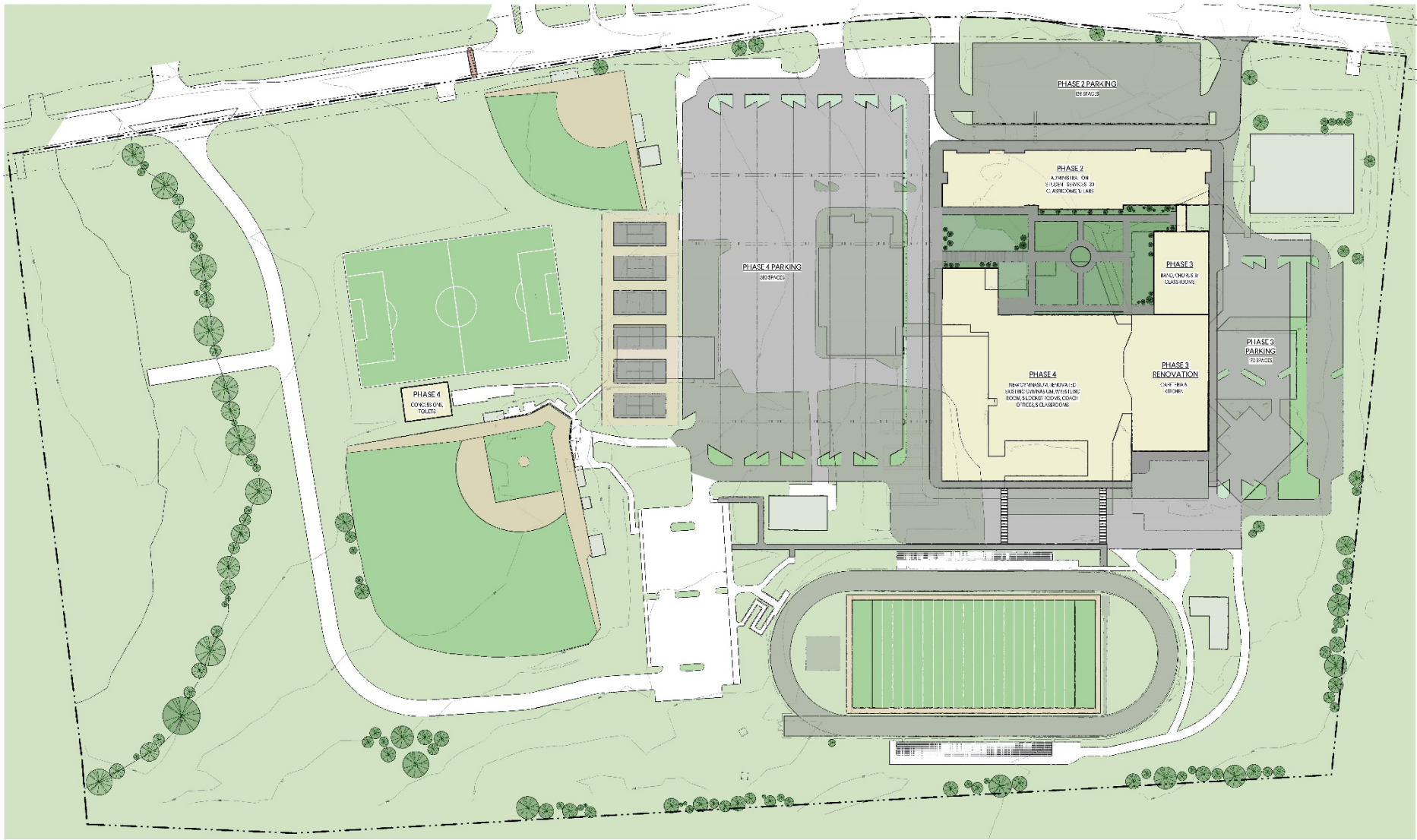

Replacing the school on its current site saved Williamson County Schools an estimated 9 million dollars.
