Updates from Oklahoma



Liz Rohrbacker Earns Oklahoma's Fourth ALEP Designation and Recognition for

Excellence

Interior Designer Liz Rohrbacker, a Principal at KKT Architects in Tulsa, is having a great year. She was recognized among *Oklahoma Magazine's* "40 Under 40" Class of 2019 for exemplary leadership, in both the office and the community; she was chosen to attend A4LE's Southern Region 20 Under 40 event in Dallas, and she earned her ALEP Certification this summer. Liz is on the Oklahoma A4LE board, and we're excited about the attention she's bringing to the importance of excellence in school design.

75th Anniversary of the Oklahoma State School Board Association Conference

The Oklahoma State School Board Association's Conference is August 22-25 at the Oklahoma City Cox Convention Center. Governor Kevin Stitt and State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister will deliver keynote addresses during Friday's General Sessions.

OSSBA is celebrating 75 years of promoting quality public education for Oklahoma's children by supporting, safeguarding, and advocating for Boards of Education. The annual conference offers school board members legislative reviews, legal roundtable discussions, and an overview of the state's education budget. Events include a golf tournament and an architectural exhibition with an opportunity to vote for "The People's Choice" of best educational design for 2019.

Funding Increases for Oklahoma Schools

After years of funding shortfalls and cutbacks, the Oklahoma legislature granted Oklahoma teachers a pay raise averaging \$6100 in 2018. A \$1200 raise was added in April. The 2019-2020 state budget appropriates an additional \$203 million for education spending, bringing Oklahoma closer to regional averages on per-pupil spending and teacher pay.

North Texas Chapter Update

On July 17th, the North Texas Chapter Board met for our annual strategic planning retreat. We had a full day of planning for the upcoming year that led to some exciting outcomes.

Through our Chapter Advisors and the folks involved in our 20U40 initiative a request was made for us to focus on a revamping of our monthly programs to better suit our audience. Many different strategies were discussed and several of them were incorporated into our programs this year. Our hope is to serve our Educational Owner representatives as well as the numerous different professions represented at our monthly programs. We are also working on providing continuing ed credits for engineers as well as interior designers. Below is the 2019-2020 list of programs.
