# PROJECT INFORMATION

Annetta Elementary School's design is centered around a secure central courtyard with access to natural daylight and a clear circulation loop around the campus with enhanced visibility. Collaborative and flexible academic pods are located on the courtyard perimeter providing easy access while maintaining a layered approach to campus security with secured zones for students located away from the rest of the building.

The Media Center is located at the heart of the campus. This technology-rich environment has direct access to the courtyard and natural light. It provides students with a variety of creative learning tools. The Cafetorium has a direct connection to the courtyard for outdoor dining and natural light and is separate from educational spaces providing greater flexibility for its use. The gymnasium is located on the Northeast corner and has a direct connection to the upper level Play Area, East Side Parking Lot and Bus Loop. Its design allows it to serve as a storm shelter for the campus.



SITE PLAN




