As they are aware, and as part of our rebranding of the association, we changed our name after a two-year process to the Association for Learning Environments. We are being very careful to make sure this transition is smooth at the chapter and region levels by putting out communications to our members about the process of this change; we are excited about positioning the association for the future.

We are currently underway with our strategic plan and have created some new committees and task forces to help guide us through our goals for the future. Here are a few:

Membership Committee—Their main charge this year is engage our emerging (young) professionals and get them involved in the association. Various programs, including the Pacific Northwest's "20 under 40" program are taking place throughout the association. We crossed a membership milestone last year reaching 4,500 members worldwide and we need your help to continue that growth! The Association for Learning Environments is a local organization with global reach, but the majority of our activities happen right here at the chapter level.

Global Organization Task Force—This task force is organized to examine how best we can structure the association to expand our membership throughout the world. Presently we are primarily concentrated in North America, Australia, and the UK. This group will explore options that will attract our association in other parts around the globe.

Content Steering Committee—the primary value of our association is content —information that helps us create the highest quality learning environments possible. We have so much great content out there and we need a way to organize that and deliver it in new and innovative ways. Among many tasks, this committee will be exploring how we can make content readily available.

There are a half dozen more committees and task forces hard at work to make this association better each year, and we appreciate the work being done by so many people to keep The Association for Learning Environments at the forefront of high quality educational facility planning.
