
Did You Know???




In Loving Memory of Patrick Zadow


A4LE Southern Region Conference













Note from the Communications Chairman: About All the Emails...

As you may have noticed, you often receive the same A4LE email twice. I apologize for this, but it is occurring due to the large number of members that are not getting the emails from the main A4LE email account at the headquarters in Scottsdale. We hope to transition to all communications coming from Scottsdale.

There are a few things you can do to insure that you are getting all communications.

- Make sure your email is correct on your membership profile, on the A4LE Website.
- Verify that A4LE is not being caught by your spam filter. Make them a safe sender.
- If you still cannot receive A4LE emails, it may be because of the use of Constant Contact email software. If that is the case, then the only work around is to provide an alternative email account, such as a gmail account.
