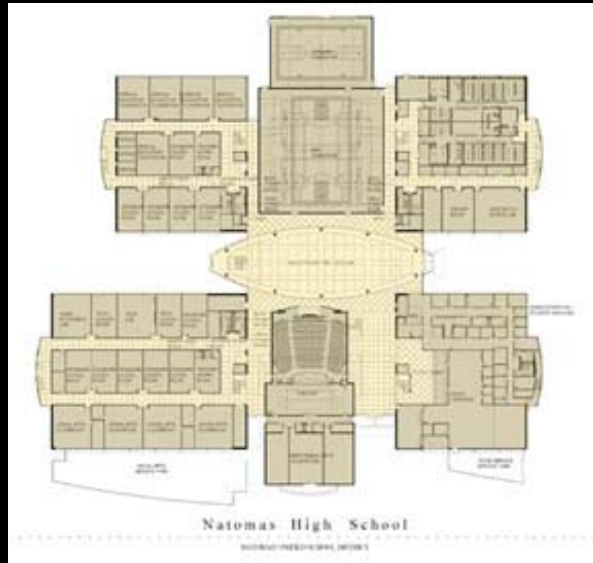

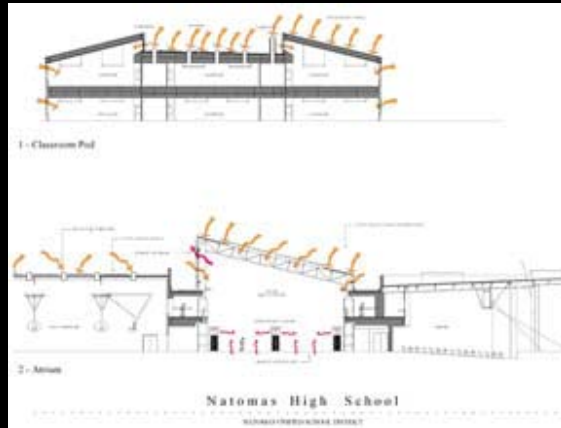

Inderkum High School is a high school for 2000 students and the first phase of the Natomas Education Center; a joint-use project with the Sacramento Public Library and the Los Rios Community College District. It is finalizing its qualifications for CHPS certification.

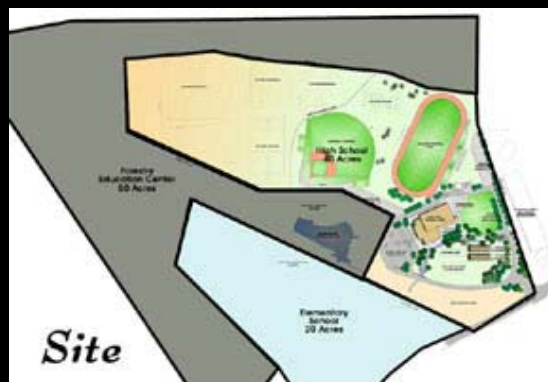

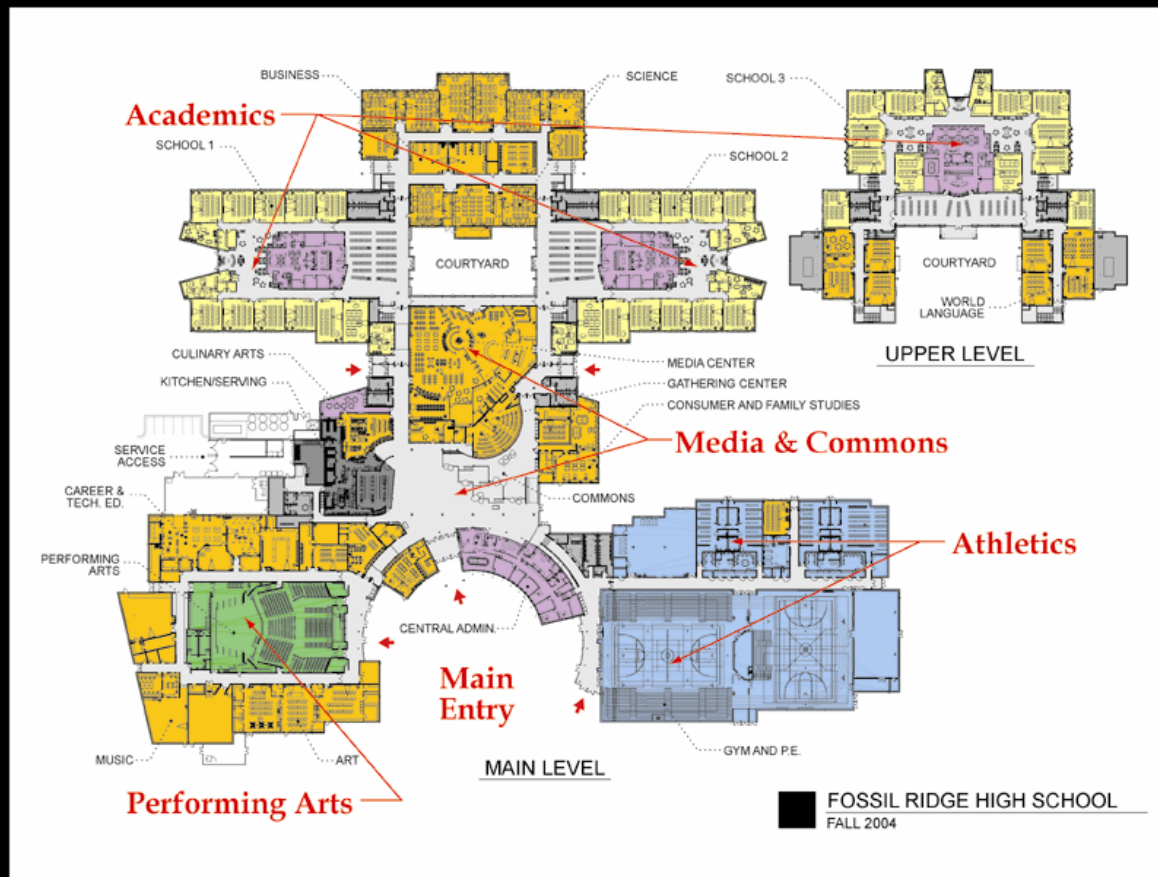

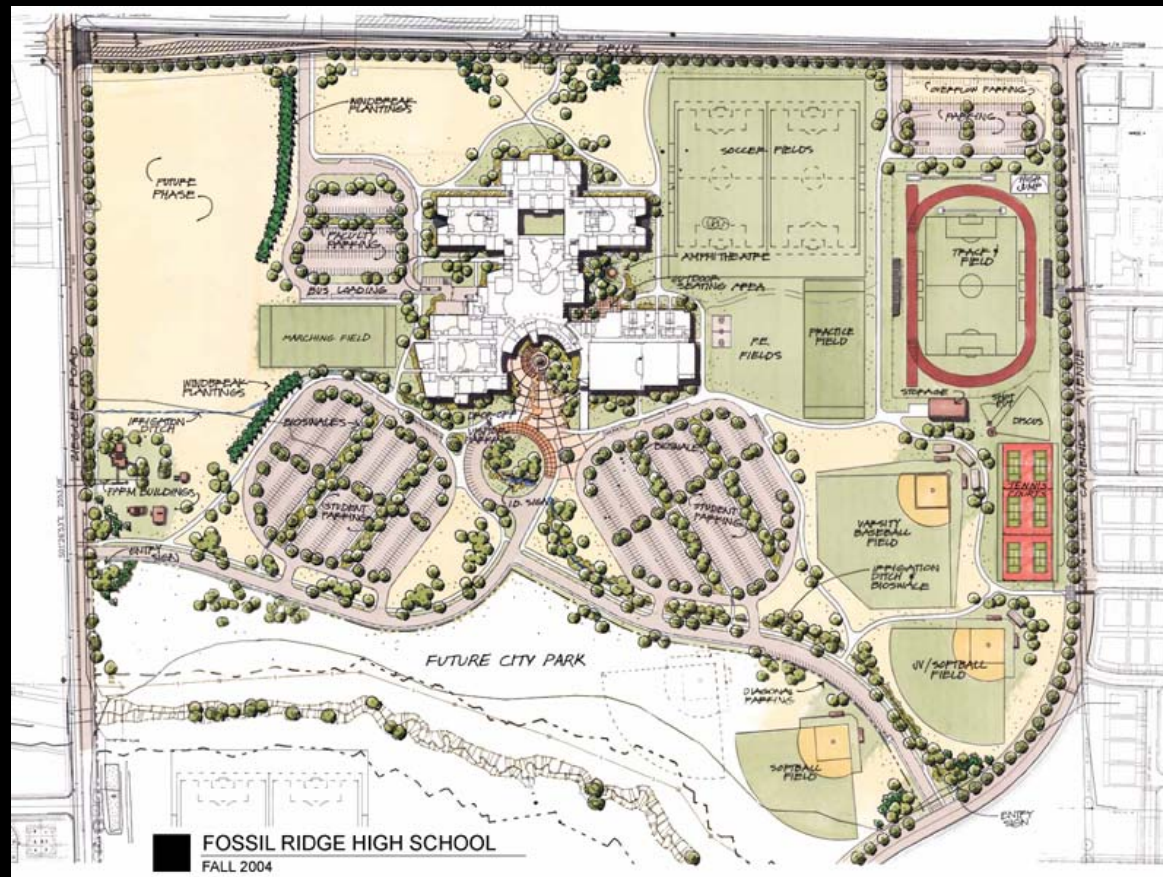
